Schedules: We would like to thank our parent volunteers who have helped make this year's schedule corrections run smoothly. Since registration, counselors have been meeting with students who need schedule corrections. This process will continue after school starts.

Add/Drop A Class: The last day to add a new class is Friday, September 3.

Teacher's Assistant: Students who would have a TA position on their schedule must pick up a TA form from counseling and have their preferred teacher sign the form. Teachers may only have 2 TAs per period. If your student cannot find a TA position they should visit the counseling office for a list of teachers who are still looking for TAs or to choose a new class by September 3.

CELD Testing: CELDT testing has been taking place over the summer and will continue into the start of the school year. All EL students must be retested each year in order to assure we are placing them in the appropriate classes.

Fee Waivers: Students who qualify for free/reduced lunch also qualify for many other scholarships and fee waivers. Counselors can distribute fee waivers/scholarships for SAT and ACT tests, college applications, Grad Night, Sr. Ball and more. A limited number of bus passes are also available. Students should fill out a form each school year and then visit their counselor.

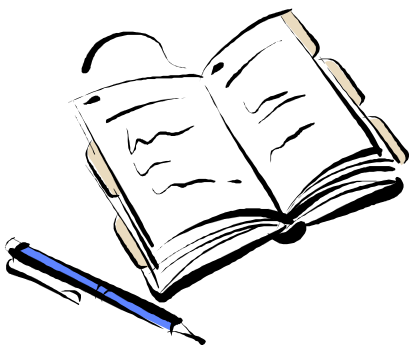
September 30, 7pm: California State University evening application workshop, located in the Instructional Performing Arts Building (IPAB).

SAT Preparation Workshop

A workshop stressing test-taking strategies and good use of time will be presented in October and November by Davis Adult School for high school students who are preparing to take the SAT college entrance exam.

The SAT college entrance exam tests grammar and usage, reading comprehension of short passages, and content from third-year high school math. Instruction will include review of vocabulary and math concepts, when to make an educated guess, and how to pace yourself.

Two experienced instructors will teach a maximum of 24 students, allowing for small groups and individual support.

The class is offered Thursday evenings 6:30 - 8:30 pm October 14, 21, 28, and November 4. Register at Davis Adult School, corner of Oak Avenue & 14th Street, 10:30 am - 2:30 pm and 3:30 - 7:30 pm. Cost is \$80.

Don't Be A Party to Teenage Drinking

Are you on the list? Look for your name at DavisParentsDo.org.

The parent groups at Davis high schools and junior highs have launched a parent information campaign, aimed at informing the adult community of teen alcohol and drug use. Our hope is that as parents learn about the prevalence of substance/alcohol use and the risks to teens who use alcohol and drugs, parents will take more active steps to prevent use by teens. Families with high school and junior high students should have received a letter

with their back-to-school materials, asking adults to sign the following:

I pledge:

- **To host only alcohol-free, tobacco-free and drug-free parties for teens**
 - **To discourage teens from consuming alcohol, tobacco or other drugs in my home; and**
- To discourage my teen(s) from attending unsupervised parties.**

If you sign this pledge your name will be included on the list of Davis families who are committed to preventing teen drug and alcohol use. teens.

Blue Devil, You Think You Can Dance?

The DHS Jazz Choir announces its first annual dance competition, "Blue Devil, You Think You Can Dance?", on Saturday, October 9, 2010 at the Richard Brunelle Performing Arts Building. Modeled after shows like So You Think You Can Dance and American Idol, this one-night dance competition is open to all DJUSD 10th-12th grade students. Ten contestants will have the chance to win one of two cash prizes. Dances may be performed as either a solo or duet piece. (Dancers who enter the competi-

tion as a couple compete as one entrant and share any prize money.) Each contestant will perform a dance to a 2-5 minute song of his or her choice. The Grand Prize winner will be chosen by a panel of three judges with backgrounds in dance, and audience members will cast their vote for the People's Choice winner. Participants will also learn and perform a group dance which will be taught by Cara Rains, the choreographer of the DHS Jazz Choir.

Beginning Sept. 7th, application forms will be available on the Jazz Choir website, in the vocal room (PA-08), and in the DHS office. Participation is limited to 10 contestants. No auditions are required, although dances must be school-appropriate. Selection of contestants and order of waiting list will be determined by lottery.

Applications must be received on or before Friday, Sept. 17th, along with a \$10 application fee. Selected contestants will be notified by Sept. 20th. Applicants who are not selected in the lottery will receive a refund after October 9th.

Contestants must attend mandatory rehearsals every day from 4:00 - 6:00 p.m. the week of Oct 4-8th.

The California Scholarship Federation (CSF) exists to promote and recognize high standards of scholarship, service and citizenship on the part of students in California schools. At this time, the approximately 1000 CSF chapters continue to foster the recognition, motivation, and education of academically talented students, and to promote among their chapter memberships the CSF ideal of service to their communities. Details on how one qualifies is on the pink application. It is not based on GPA but rather on rigor of courses taken. Please read both sides of the application for specifics.

This Fall, the two week registration period for students qualifying for CSF is from MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 13 TO FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2010. Applications may be picked up beginning September 9 at the DHS library counter, the DHS Front Receptionist counter, or in P-13.

To register, bring \$5.00 and your grade report from Spring Semester 2010 or a transcript to prove eligibility. If you cannot bring your grade report and must request a transcript from the counseling office, please keep in mind they may not be able to offer same-day service, so plan ahead. We do not keep your report card or transcript; we only verify grades. Please note that Zangle printouts are not acceptable.

Registration will take place every day during lunch in P-13. No applications will be accepted after lunch period on Friday, September 24. Students must apply and register in person; applications left in advisor mailboxes will not be accepted. Make checks payable to Davis High School CSF.
